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
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From the Editorial Desk...

Dear Confreres,



On-going Formation Corner

PROJECT EVALUATION

The project of ongoing formation and its various elements have been discussed in "Ongoing formation corner" for the past one year. Preparation and actualisation of a project require a lot of time, resources and manpower. A goal setting project – model for our ongoing formation project – provides a trajectory for arriving at the projected objectives. It integrates various components, foresees employment of adequate competences, and sets different personnel roles for its efficiency. Though the interaction of these various elements ensures its logical conclusion, it offers no guarantee of an automatic goal fulfilment. Various factors influence the functioning of a project. Project evaluation is the tool to identify the level of its functioning, to appreciate its efficient elements, to reinforce its weak elements and to remedy the glitches in it. It is concerned about verifying the efficacy of the project. A detailed study of project evaluation is imperative to complete our discussion of project of ongoing formation.

1. Misconceptions regarding evaluation

Evaluation is a fact-finding exercise. It evaluates the validity of methods used, the correctness of the contents included, the effectiveness of the projected itinerary, the impact of the formative activity and the status of the formee. It aims at improving the performance level of the project. Intermediary and final evaluations are a must to attain better results. There are some misconceptions and fears which impede a sincere evaluation. They are:

- it is a fault-finding exercise. Often there is a prevalent fear of possible personal accusations for the less effective performance of the project. For this reason, many formators do not favour an evaluation.
- it is a device for judging individuals and their style of functioning. For some formators it is a threat as it calls for accountability; for some others it is an unwanted intrusion into the rights of the formator.
- evaluation is needed only for the formees. Most of the formators are very enthusiastic about evaluating the achievement levels of the formees. Promotion of a formee to the successive level of formation depends upon it. But the fact is that it is only a part of the project and often the concerned persons are tempted to limit the evaluation to this exercise.

Our formators need not be prey to such negative ideas about evaluation. Approached with a positive attitude, it could improve considerably their personal competence and efficacy of their project. Recognising this they should volunteer for a comprehensive and periodical evaluation.

2. The notion of evaluation

Many consider the practice of evaluation as a 20th century phenomenon. In fact, it developed side by side the industrial revolution in different areas of the industrialised society, ranging from production lines to education. An evaluation of teacher's performance was already in practice in England in the 19th century itself. Royal commissions in England and presidential commissions in the USA were engaged for the purpose. Proposals of improvements and policies were based on their reports.² The word "evaluation" indicates "the process of judging or calculating the quality, importance, amount, or value of something».³ This term is widely used in educational assessment today more than ever, be it of the individual student or the academic programme. It refers to various moments of taking stock of the progress of the project. It tries to analyse the quality of the process of education. It uses various instruments like feedback, questionnaires, descriptive reports, etc. It foresees collecting data for assessing the quality of the formative itinerary, assessing each element of it.⁴

The description above clearly denotes that in a project of formation, evaluation plays the same role of quality assessment in an industry. It reviews the project and verifies the effectiveness of its components in achieving the projected goal or objective. Evaluation should be present right from its beginning to its end for better results. It requires the **situational analysis** at the beginning to situate the point of departure,⁵ the **formative evaluation** during its actualisation to rectify the possible errors and the **summative evaluation** at its conclusion to assess the overall performance.⁶ All these are equally important for the success of the project.

3. Some models of evaluation

A good project also contains its evaluation model with well-defined criteria. These differ according to the concepts and structures that it contains. All of them invariably arrive at due conclusions on the performance of the project.⁷ The selection of these depend upon the persons who prepare the project. The formation team can adopt a suitable instrument of evaluation, that it deems effective.

Some of the popular evaluation models used in formation projects are: **comparison model** (comparing the subjects and obtaining points on an evaluation scale), **goal assessment model** (assessing the goal achievement level) and **diagnostic model** (reviewing the situation of the formee before and after the formative action). However, many scholars suggest the use of different models suitable for different elements of the project. It also can vary according to the type of itinerary proposed. «For example, consider combining test data from a goals-oriented approach, resource allocation data from the decision-oriented approach, and observational and interview data from the naturalistic approach». In conclusion, the criteria of choosing a particular model should be its ability to answer various questions about the project and its performance.

4. Ongoing formation and evaluation

The unorganised nature of ongoing formation due to various incompatibilities – discussed in previous issues – make its evaluation difficult. Especially when it is considered as the responsibility of each individual priest to revive his vocational commitment. The best solution could be organising groups according to age, responsibilities, special needs, culture, geographical areas etc., so that the formative activity would be a concrete response to their real life situations. Preparing a formation project for such target groups is viable. Once such programme is in place then evaluation also is possible as it provides a structural and concrete framework. Furthermore, different means of priestly fraternity – fraternal meetings, spiritual direction and confession, retreats, a common table, common life, and priestly associations — can be given a concrete structure by enveloping them in a project. It is not for a rigorous enforcement, but for providing an appealing and useful means. It proposes evaluation as an integral part, the result of which will be helpful for updating and bettering the formative itinerary. Lacking such an integral and structural approach, ongoing formation would remain vague, not serving the purpose.

In the framework of a project every person involved therein becomes its protagonist. Each one feels enthusiastic as an active player in this review exercise. This process evaluates not only the projected itinerary but also the unforeseen matters that influenced the realisation of it. The timing of evaluation could be at three moments like any project: at the initial stage to understand from where to start, during the formative action to verify the efficacy and at the conclusion for an overall evaluation.

Questionnaire and feedback could be two effective models of evaluation. It could be at individual level or at community level. The subjects who undertake the formative itinerary of ongoing formation are adults and priests. Special care should be taken to make them not feel forced or constrained to offer an opinion. In a spirit of fraternal solicitude, the superiors and the formators need to elicit a sincere evaluation. It must come out of evoking the personal responsibility in availing and fructifying the project. Conscious of his personal situation at the beginning and at the conclusion, the individual shall give a sincere opinion of the pros and cons of the formative itinerary that he undertook. It is out of concern for the betterment of the programme and the benefit of the congregation.

Conclusion

Ongoing formation aims at rekindling the gift of vocation. A well-prepared project, focused on specific target groups, is necessary to make it more concrete and functional. It begins with a **diagnostic evaluation** to set clear objectives and to organise formative itinerary. The **intermediary/formative evaluation**, during its actualisation, rectifies possible errors. At the conclusion of the project a **summative evaluation** gives an overview of the whole project and its goal-reaching efficacy (models of these shall be provided in the next issue). Superiors, formators and the subjects are protagonists of evaluation. Evaluation should be

approached positively and sincerely. It should be done with mutual respect, avoiding unwanted criticism and uncharitable remarks. It should concern the functionality and efficacy of the project in attaining its objectives and goals. Such a pedagogical approach to ongoing formation, undoubtedly, can revive the members and the congregation.

It is indeed grace upon grace because most of the members of the Province were able to



Currently, Dau Tieng Parish is served by two MF priests: Fr. Joseph Nguyen Thai Nghi, and Fr. Joseph Tran Van Lam. Dau Tieng parish is also in the process of constructing the Church with an estimated completion cost of nearly 40 billion VND. This work is at the completion stage.



Pastoral Projects for Children in the Mid - Autumn Festival

The festival is held on the 15th day of the 8th month of the lunar calendar with full moon at night (this year it was on October 1). This is also a highlight on the "Missionaries Footprint" of the Vietnamese Missionaries of the Faith in the particular mission of the Congregation. 


Agreement of Understanding between the Diocese of Myitkyina and the MF Vice-province of Myanmar

The agreement was signed after due consultation with the Presbyteral Council of the Diocese, with Shadau MF community and with the consent of the Council of the Vice-province. With this agreement the Missionaries of Faith (Fathers) are officially granted permission to have a Retreat and Pilgrimage Centre in the Diocese of Myitkyina. The location is at Shadau Village, St. Paul's Catholic Church Shadau Parish, Kachin State.
