To My Dear Confreres,


Our Spirituality is an apostolically oriented one; we live the experience of being sent forth by God to witness the Gospel and to imitate the lifestyle of



Parish of Our Lady of Czestochowa, Rustica (RM)


• 60th anniversary of the canonical erection of the parish




• Month of the Holy Rosary

• Importance of Youth Ministry in Today's Church - St. Joseph Parish in Grey Lynn



• Final salute to Fr. Filipo Petelo Fila, mf - 18/12/69- 22/5/2022

June is the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Through the waves of that blessed heart we bid last salute to our confrere Fr. Filipo Fila with the Requiem Mass celebration at the Immaculate Conception Cathedral of Apia, Samoa. His Lordship, Archbishop Alapati Mataeliga with the Samoan Clergy and the people of God of Apia raised their prayers to heaven for our young tubby mate from Tufulele. The Malie Parish Choir really gave the solemnity to the sad occasion. During the feast of *Corpus Christi*, the Parish of Vaitele sang a vivid tune, but the next early morning Malie truly sang the sombre tune, the old Gregorian chants in a clear but piano softness that makes the heart and mind float in the mist of ages, thinking about the life of this stubborn brothers of ours.





Fr Filipo Fila was born in the village of Tufulele. He was brought by his grandparents and was a cradle catholic that was formed up in the two spiritualities of the culture and religion. He had an academic upbringing with the Marist Sisters and later on at Chanel College with the Fathers.

His journey with the Missionaries of Faith started in August 1991, when the first 13 Samoans priests came back home. Eight of them stayed back in the Pacific, while 5 went back to Rome for other destinations. According to Filipo, he was attracted to the black flowing soutane of the first lot that stayed. Fr Iosefo Timu was the Parish Priest at Leulumoega at the time. Together with some of their youth group he was opting to try their vocation at Moamoa, but the deeper spiritual prompting was directing him to Lotofaga where Fr Giuseppe Maccalli was with the MF Seminary. He got his blessings from his Family and off he went without looking back. In 1993 from Lotofaga, Samoa, he ended up at Cortona, Italia, as an aspirant and he followed through the religious formation and was ordained Priest in 2001 at Sora, Italy. He served there for three years, and then he spent 2 years as a missionary at St. Vincent in the Antilles of South America.

In 2005, he was shifted to Samoa and in New Zealand he served in the establishment of the community at Panmure, Onehunga and Grey

Lynn. In 2017, he got into medical complications and could not continue to work in the active apostolate. He was pensioned and became the first resident of our St. Joseph's Hospice at Vaitele where he stayed till his passing away. He was always faithful to the word granted to God as a Priest and is blessed to be the first Missionary of Faith to be laid to rest at our Centre at Vaitele.

"You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek." You are a priest forever, with you I have placed my only son. "Neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord." Rest in Peace Fr. Filipo, until we meet again.

• News from Holy Family Parish, Porirua East, Wellington




Holy Family Parish, Porirua East, is under the pastoral care of Fr. Andrew Atonio, mf, Parish Priest, and Fr. Isaac Ramesh Songa, mf, and Fr. Peter Timoteo, mf, as assistants. The parish is quite unique in the richness of the diversity of different cultures, and the depth of the faith of the parishioners. This was most recently seen at the Confirmation and First Holy Communion ceremonies held in the month of May. In spite of being interrupted by Covid, the dedicated team of Missionary of Charity nuns and lay members of the parish prepared over 40 young people to receive these sacraments. H. E. John Card. Dew, just back from his trip to Rome, conferred the Sacrament of Confirmation to these young people on 15

May 2022. Cardinal Dew asked the sponsors and parishioners to pray during the ceremony for those receiving the Sacrament. The prayerful atmosphere was very noticeable and added dignity to the occasion. On Sunday, 22 May, the young people were back to receive their first Holy Communion, with one young man being confirmed as he was sick on the Sunday before. The young people had been well-trained, knew what an amazing gift they were receiving that day and were reverent throughout. Their smart white dresses and suits also added colour to the occasion. May this be the first of many Holy Communions for each of them, and may they be richly blessed in their lives.



• Auckland City Hospital Ecumenical Chaplaincy Team



Auckland City Hospital (ACH) is a public hospital and one of the biggest in New Zealand. It has more than 1,300 beds and more than 10,000 staff. ACH offers health care services in almost all sectors such as transplantations, mental health care, adult care, and specialised children's care. ACH covers the whole of New Zealand. ACH also covers most of the Pacific Island countries as the nearest acute and advanced hospital in the region. More than 50% of the patients come from outside of Auckland. Patients even come from the South Island of New Zealand, the Pacific Islands such as Fiji, Tonga, Samoa, and other islands, and some patients come from cruise ships and fishing vessels too. ACH offers an air service ambulance to bring patients from outside of Auckland and other Pacific countries.

ACH not only provides physical care but also holistic care such as

spiritual care and emotional care for all people in the hospital. The ACH chaplaincy team takes spiritual care for patients, their families, as well as staff. Chaplaincy at ACH has three teams: Amorangi (Maori - indigenous people), Catholic, and Ecumenical. The Amorangi team provides pastoral care for Maori, the Catholic team takes care of Catholics and the Ecumenical team looks after all people regardless of their faith or no faith. We cover the whole hospital 24 hrs. per day for the whole week and for 365 days of the year, including public holidays. We work together as a team. On every Sunday we conduct Ecumenical prayer service, and Holy Mass for Catholics. The Catholic team offers mid-week services and Holy Mass. We also provide Holy Sacraments every day. The Catholic team especially manages this service well. We offer other services or ceremonies for people such as weddings, funerals, memorial services, commissioning services, etc. From time to time, we all get together to take part in the events. Recently we had the commissioning service for our Ecumenical Volunteer Chaplaincy Assistants. All team members participated in the service. All members of our team also attended the celebration for the 30th year of Fr Talipope Vaifale's priestly Anniversary Eucharistic Celebration at Our Lady of Assumption Church at Onehunga in Auckland. The Catholic team has one full-time chaplain priest and three part-time lay chaplains, Fr. Talipope Tuala Vaifale, and a couple of oncall priests, of the Congregation of the Missionaries of Faith, Fr. Iosefo Timu, Fr. Joseph Thirumala and Fr. Tino Consedine Toleafoa. The Amorangi team has one ordained priest and a couple of assistant chaplains.

The Ecumenical team has four ordained ministers and fifteen Volunteer Chaplaincy Assistants and a few locum chaplains. We have regular team meetings and we constantly learn from each other.

I am impressed by the Catholic team as they provide pastoral care for their patients in the hospital. Under the leadership of Fr. Talipope, mf, the Catholic team, has been offering comprehensive pastoral care. They visit their patients regularly every day including public holidays. The Ecumenical, Amorangi, and Catholic teams exchange referrals with each other if any patients, families, or staff want a visit by their own church priest. The Catholic team always responds promptly to referrals even for midnight call-outs.

I am honoured to share with you what pastoral care our chaplaincy team offers for people unwell physically, emotionally, and spiritually at our hospital, especially our good relationship and sharing of our ministry as Catholics and Ecumenical.
